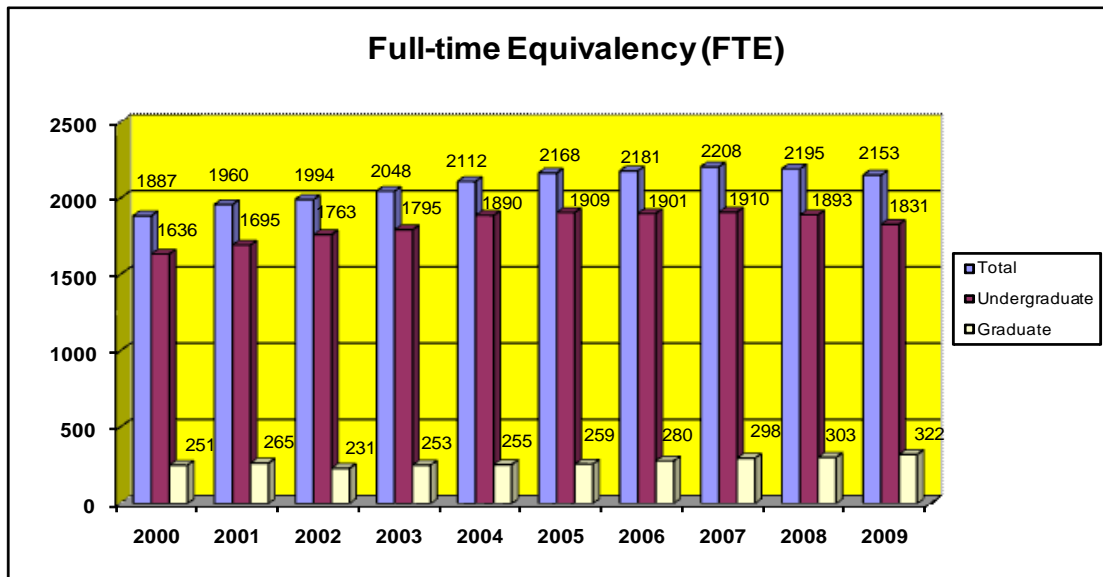

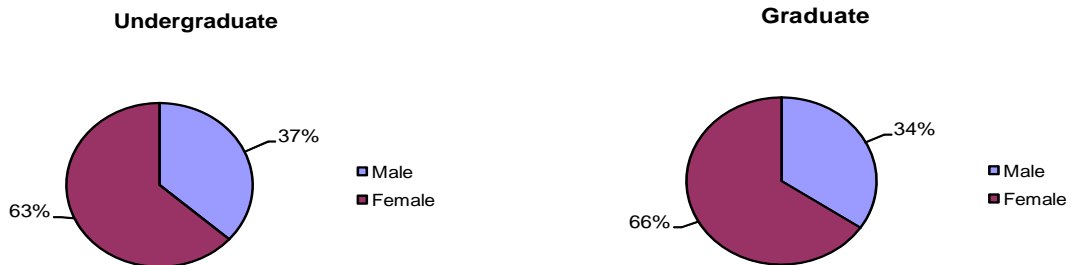

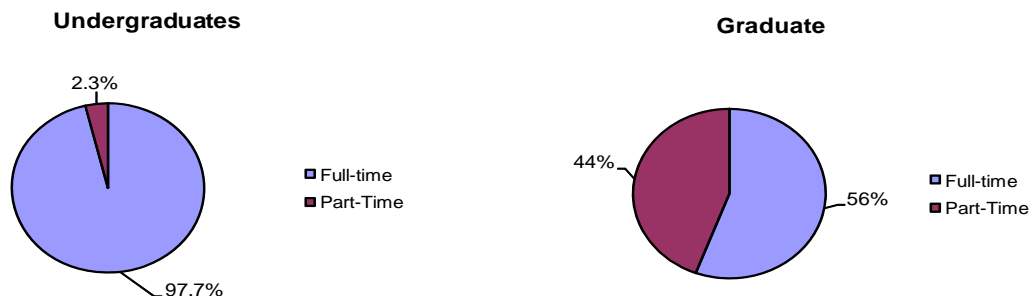

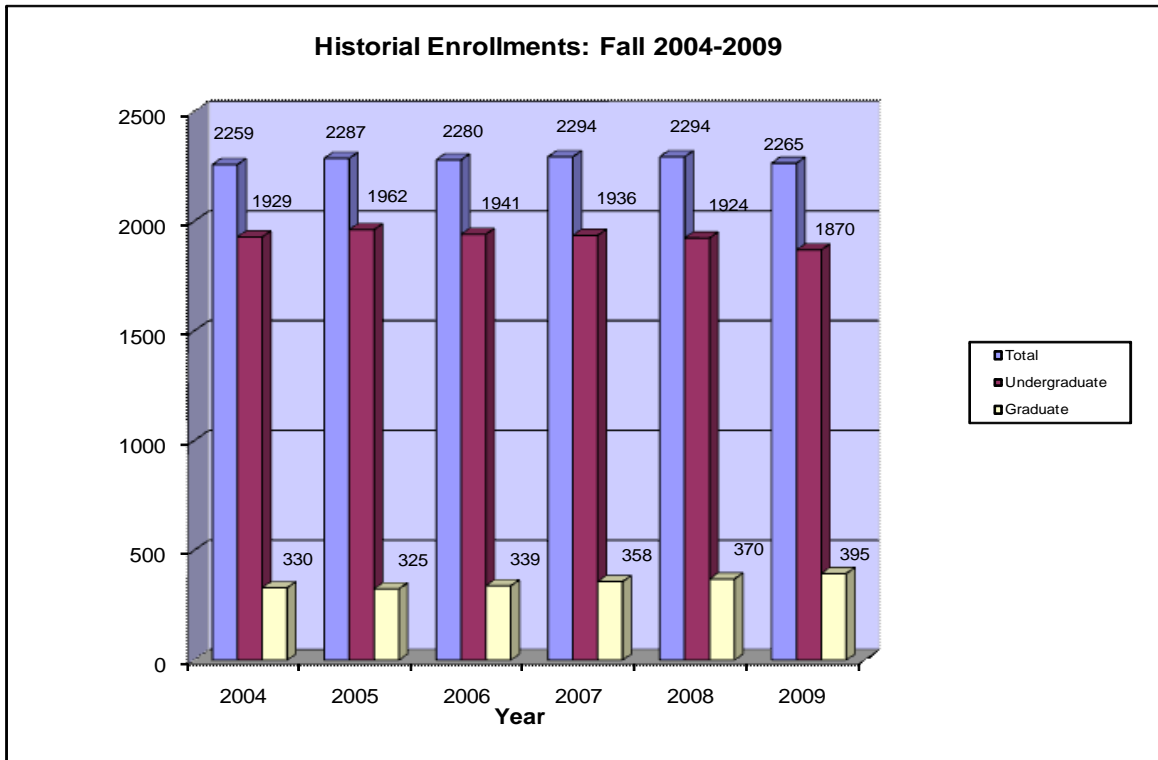

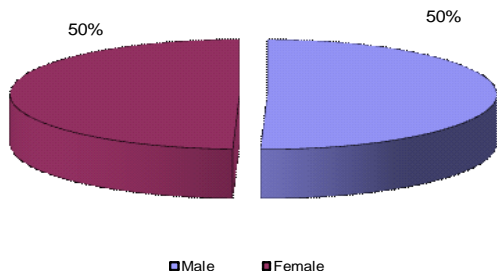

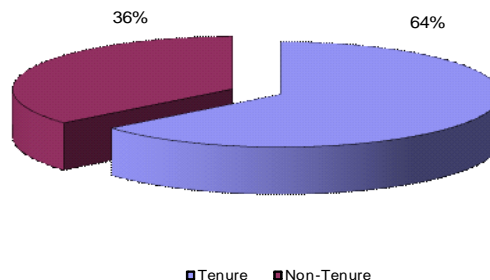

% of Full-time Faculty by Tenure Status

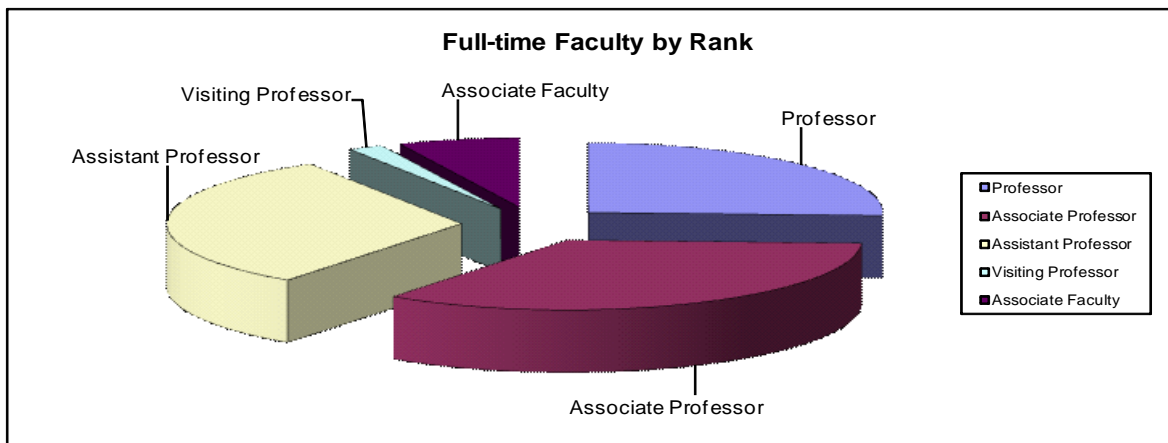

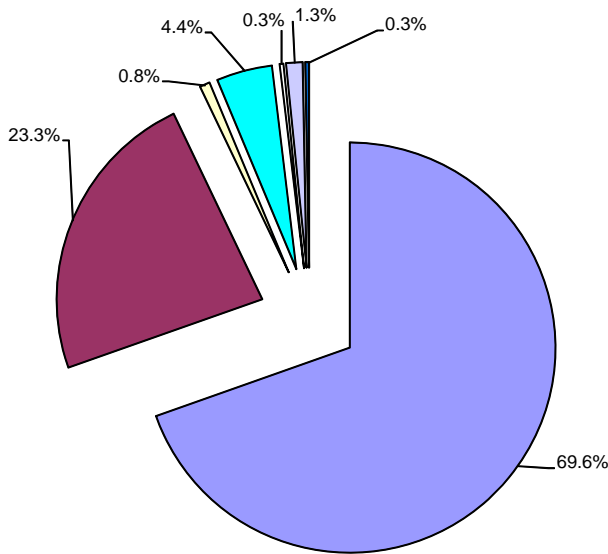

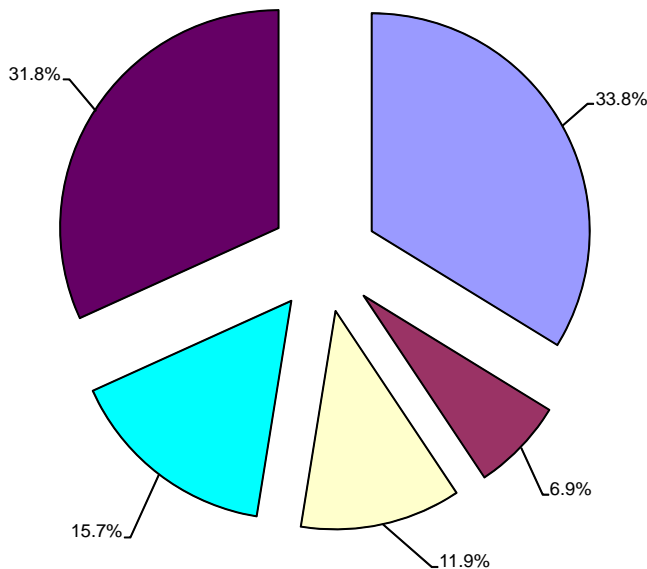
